

IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM HUMAN RESOURCES

Updated: Thursday, April 16, 2020

Based on the information provided by Governor Lamont to keep the state closed, the Chancery and the Pastoral Center will continue to remain closed until further notice.

We are obligated to follow the directives set forth by the governor, which extends the closing of the state to May 20, 2020. And, it is important to note that the Governor has clarified that May 20th is a re-evaluation date, not a set date to open the state.

Obviously, we would hope to be allowed to open sooner, but we are bound by the directives of the Governor, who is closely following the advice of the CDC and the CT Department of Public Health, as well as working in conjunction with the Governors from surrounding states.

To clarify, the Chancery and the Pastoral Center will continue to remain closed. We will update you when we have relevant information to provide.

With COVID-19, there is no way to estimate when the state will recover sufficiently enough for it to be safe for everyone to resume their normal activities, or as normal as possible during this period.

Employees who have the ability to work from home are requested to continue to do so. Please continue to consult with your Department Director to determine your work status during this period. It is possible that an employee may be asked to come in to work for a day or partial day during the closure period to take care of essential work.

The maintenance, housekeeping, and kitchen staff will be continue to be required to work during the period of this closure to be sure that our residents at the Pastoral Center are cared for.

Mail delivery will continue to the Chancery and the Pastoral Center and will be sorted and distributed to individual mailboxes on a daily basis.
